The Weather

The forecaster say to look for high temperatures today a few degrees warmer than yesterday. They are also watching Tropical Storm Cristobal as it advances north over the weekend. Due to the departing tropical system combined with a quick moving dryline, the conditions are ripe for soaring temperatures, on Tuesday possibly approaching 105°. While parts of the forecast are uncertain, the potential is there.

Today: Mostly sunny skies and a high temperature should be near 89°. Winds will be S-SW at around 5 mph.

Tonight: The skies will be mostly clear with a low near 71°. There will be light S-SE breezes.

Thursday: Sunny with a high near 92°. The wind will be S-SW near 5 mph.

Thursday Night: Mostly clear and a low around 71° in the overnight. Winds will be light from the S-Se.

Friday: Sunny and up to 93° with a S wind at 5 mph.

Protests Planned in Lampasas

Lampasas Radio will be interviewing the young man who is planning the march from WM Brook Park to the Courthouse on Friday. Asiel Gary will be in Lampasas Radio studios tomorrow at 8am with Ken Gontarek to discuss the march.

Police Chief Sammy Bailey and Mayor Misti Talbert released a joint press release that assures residents that they are not only working with the planners of the events, but in some cases their parents as well. It reads as follows:

"Citizens have a 1st Amendment right to freedom of speech and assembly, there is no permit required by the City of Lampasas. However, the event organizers have been instructed that they need to make reservations and follow rules for usage of the area that they seek to have their events.

We have had several conversations with the group organizers and one parent for the protest on Thursday and the march on Friday. Both groups are reaching out to the Dispatch Record, if they have not already to make themselves known and they do not want to cause anyone fear. They have something they'd like to say and they have the right to say it.

Both groups are planning peaceful events and are taking precautions to help monitor for anyone that might not be peaceful minded Yes, we have reached out to them to discuss their events and we have offered out assistance to maintain peace and safety for those having the event, our community and our officers. The know we will not tolerate violence and/or destruction of our community. They don't want to be the cause of any, either. Both groups are aware that they have a responsibility to the events, those attending the events and our community; they are planning peaceful events that are without destruction and violence. They also understand that they need to follow guidelines to help prevent the spread of the coronavirus. We have been invited to join the Friday march to ensure it is done in a safe manner for all. We are aware of these young men, their families, and their ties to Lampasas. Both group event organizers are from Lampasas and have their parents assisting them with their planning to help ensure the health and safety of all. Yes, they may work or attend college in other cities, but they are from Lampasas, which does not matter, as they have their right to peaceful assembly and freedom of speech regardless of where they are from or live." Texans could receive up to a year of unemployment benefits under second extension of aid

The state triggered an extended benefits period, adding an additional 13 weeks of unemployment staring in July. It is the second benefits extension this year.

Texans receiving unemployment could be eligible for a total of 52 weeks of benefits — double the typical amount of time aid is available — as the state triggered an extended benefits period, according to the Texas Workforce Commission. Unemployed Texans have historically received up to 26 weeks of benefits. The U.S. Department of Labor notified the Texas Workforce Commission on Monday that the state triggered what's called State Extended Benefits, which provides 13 additional weeks of unemployment aid. That comes after a federal coronavirus relief bill previously extended some

unemployment benefits for 13 weeks under what's called Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation.

The first week Texans could start receiving these newest extended benefits is the week ending July 4, which is 13 weeks after the PEUC extension took effect in the state. People must first exhaust the standard 26 weeks, plus the additional 13 weeks under PEUC, before receiving the additional 13 weeks of extended benefits, said Cisco Gamez, spokesperson for the commission.

PEUC is also what allows Texans to receive an additional \$600 in benefits per week for up to 13 weeks. It is available until July 25. Extended benefits date back to 1971 and kick in during times of high unemployment. In April, the state's unemployment rate was 12.8%, topping the previous high of 9.2% in 1986. The state's unemployment rate exceeded the 5% threshold to trigger the latest extended benefits period, which the federal government reimburses to the state. According to the Department of Labor, 2.2 million Texans have filed for unemployment since mid-March. The Texas Workforce Commission has paid out \$9.7 billion in benefits using state and federal funds.
