The Weather

High yesterday was 85° Low this morning was 71°

Look for a warm humid day with gusty winds. The forecasters say we may see a pop-up shower or two this afternoon. The first part of next week should be warm and breezy, and temperatures will be on an increase with the heat index Tuesday and Wednesday moving into heat-advisory range.

Today: Clearing skies with S winds increasing this afternoon to 10-15 mph gusting to 25 mph. The high temperature will be near 92°.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy with S-SE winds near 10-15 mph with possible gusts to 25 mph. The low will be near 74°.

Sunday: Mostly cloudy with a high temperature near 92° and a 20% chance of showers in the afternoon. Winds will be S at 10-20 mph with gusts as high as 30 mph.

Sunday Night: Mostly cloudy with a low temperature near 75° and S wind near 15-20 mph gusting to 30 mph.

Monday: Skies will be partly sunny with the high temperature near 94°. Winds will be S at 15-20 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Monday Night: A low near 75° and mostly cloudy skies. Wind will be S at 15 mph with gusts as high as 25 mph.

The Sahara Dust Cloud nicknamed 'Godzilla" due to its size is sitting on top of us today. Puerto Rico saw the highest concentrations of dust particles recorded in the past 15 years. The EPA website shows today to be unhealthy for sensitive groups, but the skies are supposed to clear a bit today. Tomorrow is forecast to have moderate air quality. Another plume of dust will also track across the Caribbean this weekend. Some of that dust might reach the U.S. Gulf Coast next week.

The Blotter.

The Lampasas Police Dept. Blotter for Friday shows an early morning report of a suspicious person in the 700 block of W. Ave E at 12:08am. Suspicious activity was reported in the 900 block of Campbell St. at 4:22am. There was a reported public intoxication in the 1500 block of S. Key Ave at 10:41am. The afternoon shows a reported forgery in the 200 block of S. Key at 3:46pm. A missing person was reported on Perkins St. at 5:57pm (they were found). In the 300 block of N. The Jail Log shows the arrest of 33 year old Michael Brackett Jr., of Kempner on an out-of-county charge.

Covid-19 Concerns


Texas Governor Greg Abbott yesterday issued a proclamation closing bars in Texas and allowing restaurants to operate at 50%. Rafting/Tubing businesses had to close, and gatherings of more than 100 people are to be guided by local officials.

The numbers read like this; As of Friday, 137,624 Texans have tested positive for the corona virus. This is 5,707 more than the day before and 34,319 more than a week ago. Friday Texas had 5,102 patients hospitalized as well. Texas has reported more than 32,000 confirmed new cases in the last week, an average of 4,600 per day, with record high positive tests of 5,996 on Thursday. When COVID-19 started, it took Texas 76 days to reach 50,000 cases, yet it only took 31 more days to reach 100,000. So in half the time Texas racked up an additional 50,000 cases.

Lampasas County currently has 23 cases with 11 active and 12 recovered. However, our neighboring Bell County is having a large increase. In the last 7 days Bell County has had 298 residents test positive. With 525 active cases, the 298 positive cases of the last week now make up over 50% of the active cases in Bell County.

On Friday the state reported 12,398 available staffed beds which includes 1,284 staffed ICU beds. Dr. Hay, the Lampasas County Health Au-

thority, shared that we really don't have many hospitalizations, but hospitals in larger counties are scaling back to have better capacity. As of yesterday afternoon our area (Trauma Service Area L) had 264 available hospital beds, 26 available

ICU beds, and 171 ventilators. According to KCEN news, Bell County Judge Blackburn is concerned about this ". Bell County alone had 15 corona virus patients in hospitals but 11 of those patients were in the ICU as of Wednesday. Meanwhile, the entire trauma service area only had another 12 ICU beds free for additional patients. So if just 12 of the more than five hundred cases Bell County is currently tracking take a turn for the worst, Bell County would have a problem.

Governor Abbott had an interview on NBC DFW, and said "If we are unable to slow the spread over the next few weeks, then we will have to reevaluate the extent to which businesses are open, because if it's not contained in the next couple of weeks, it will be completely out of control and Texas will have to ratchet back," So we wait and see...again...

Meanwhile, wash your hands, wear your mask, social distance and STAY HOME!
