Firework Safety



(Texas A&M Forestry Service) If you plan to set off your own fireworks, please follow these safety tips: (1) Before you celebrate, always check and comply with local government officials for any burn bans or other restrictions. (2) Read and follow all warnings and instruction labels on fireworks. (3) Use fireworks only under close adult supervision and in safe areas away from structures, dry grass and brush.(3) Keep a hose, bucket of water and wet towels nearby in case of a malfunction or fire. (4) Dispose of used fireworks in a bucket of water. (5) Never ignite fireworks in a container, especially glass or metal.

Also, to help prevent wildfires during hot and dry conditions: (1) Avoid parking and idling in tall, dry grass. Catalytic converters can get hot enough to ignite the grass under a vehicle. (2) Ensure chains and other metal parts aren't dragging from your vehicle—they throw sparks. (3) Avoid placing your grill near flammable vegetation or materials, never leave your grill unattended, and ensure coals are completely extinguished when you are done.

The Blotter

Heat Related Illness in Texas

(Texas Tribune) A dangerous heat wave that blanketed Texas this month has prompted a public health crisis that's particularly affecting older people and outdoor workers across the state. At least nine people have died from the heat in one South Texas county, the local medical examiner reported, eight of them older than 60. In sweltering Texas prisons, at least nine inmates, including two men in their 30s, have died of heart attacks or unknown causes in facilities that lack air conditioning.

The unrelenting 100-degree temperatures across the state shattered weather records this month amid a heat wave that's stretching into its fourth week in some parts of Texas. The heat dome is moving east, so Texans could finally see some relief after weeks of oppressive heat.

Emergency department visits related to the heat also surged across Texas this month as alarmed medical examiners and local public health officials alike are warning residents about health risks from the life-threatening heat. Heat is one of the most dangerous types of weather, typically killing more people annually in the U.S. than hurricanes, tornadoes or flooding.

In the last two weeks, a CDC region that includes Texas and the states that border it set three new daily records for the number of heat-related emergency department visits since 2017, the first year for which data is available, according to the CDC.

On June 20, for example, more than 1,100 people per 100,000 emergency department visits were treated for heat-related illness by emergency departments in Texas and its neighboring states, a record high for the region.

Texas' state health department does not yet have complete data on how many Texans died from the heat this month. Lara Anton, senior press officer for DSHS, said the state will likely have a more complete picture of the human toll from the heat wave in about six weeks.

DPS Ordered to Release Records

According to a story in the Texas Tribune a state district judge on Thursday ordered the Texas Department of Public Safety to begin the process of releasing public records related to law enforcement's response to the Uvalde school shooting, granting a request by The Texas Tribune and other news organizations.

Over a dozen news organizations sued DPS last year, accusing it of unlawfully withholding the records related to the May shooting at Robb Elementary School. The records concern the botched police response, during which officers waited over an hour to confront the shooter who killed 19 children and two teachers. Nearly 400 officers had descended on the school by the time the shooting was over.

The 261st Civil District Court Judge Daniella DeSeta Lyttle granted a motion for summary judgment on behalf of the Tribune, its partner ProPublica and other local, state and national newsrooms. The records will not be immediately available.

Lyttle ordered DPS to produce by Aug. 31 a proposed log of redactions it wants to make to the public records.DPS could choose to appeal the judgment before then.

The organizations have each filed requests under the Texas Public Information Act for information detailing the response by various authorities. According to state law, records are presumed public unless a government body cites a specific exemption under the Texas Public Information Act that allows information to be withheld. DPS claimed that the records can be withheld because they are related to an ongoing investigation. The news organizations argued that there is no such investigation because the shooter's guilt is not in question and the 18-year-old acted alone.

DPS has refused to release records, even as the agency has selectively disclosed some information through public testimony, third-party analyses and news conferences.
