Kempner Water Issues Notice



Kempner Water issued the following notice this morning:

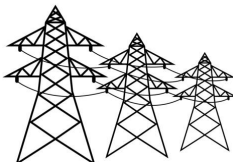
"Stillhouse Lake, which is our only source of water, is at a critically low level. Currently it is at 607.6 feet elevation and is dropping 1 inch every 2 days. When the water level reaches 605 feet elevation, water production at our plant will slow down and 604 feet, production will stop. We are installing an extension in August that will give us a lower intake level and potentially buy us some time. Please be aware that we are not seeing much conservation of water in our system. If the lake level drops to 606 feet elevation, we will be forced to implement stage IV Water Conservation restrictions which are stricter and will not allow you to use your irrigation systems or fill a pool, only hand watering with a bucket will be authorized. Conservation enforcement will include fines for excessive use.

Thanks to those of you who currently are conserving. If you see a possible leak, please notify the office or on call person as soon as possible, so we can get the leak repaired."

Lampasas Radio reached out to the City of Lampasas regarding this notice and how it might affect local water customers. They are verifying water conditions with the Central Texas Water Supply Corporation and how all this might affect the City of Lampasas.

Texas to Receive Grant for the Electric Grid



(Texas Tribune) The Texas Division of Emergency Management will receive \$60.6 million from the federal government to help utilities strengthen infrastructure on the state's electricity grid. The U.S. Department of Energy announced

Thursday that it will award the funds so that Texas' power grid might better withstand extreme weather events. "These grants will help modernize the electric grid to reduce impacts of extreme weather and natural disasters while enhancing power sector reliability," U.S. Secretary of Energy Jennifer Granholm said in a statement.

State emergency officials will develop parameters for how to use the money. The funds could go toward programs such as trimming trees around power lines or improving how equipment functions in extreme heat or cold, for example.

Grid resilience has been top of mind for Texans since the 2021 winter storm forced power grid operators to call for electricity cuts to millions in the state. Hundreds of people died as the freezing weather took hold and residents could no longer heat their homes.

Texas legislators later required power generators to better prepare their equipment for extreme weather, but recent storms have showed the ongoing vulnerability of the transmission system.

A winter storm in late January and early February knocked out power in various parts of the state, including Austin, where tree limbs weighed down with ice fell onto power lines. Severe storms in June took out power lines in East Texas.

The Department of Energy plans to give out \$2.3 billion over the next five years to states, territories and tribes to address power grid resilience issues.
