Property Tax Bills Headed to Governor Abbott

(Texas Tribune) A landmark \$18 billion tax cut for property owners in the state was headed to Gov. Greg Abbott's desk late Thursday, with a deal that drew near-unanimous support from legislators.

Both chambers adjourned Thursday evening, ending the second special session Abbott had called this summer to hammer out an agreement on property tax relief. There are 3 bills that make up the package: Senate Bill 2 details the proposed property tax cuts; Senate Bill 3, a franchise tax relief bill; and House Joint Resolution 2, a constitutional amendment required to authorize the tax cuts.

The package puts \$12.6 billion of the state's historic budget surplus toward making cuts to school taxes for all property owners, dropping property taxes an average of more than 40% for some 5.7 million Texas homeowners, and offering brand-new tax savings for smaller businesses and other commercial and non-homesteaded properties. The voters would need to approve the package in November for the cuts to take effect this year. During floor debate Thursday, Democrats attempted to insert benefits for renters, teacher pay raises and more money for public education into the tax-cuts package in a series of floor amendments but were unsuccessful.

(cont'd from front) The most novel part of the plan, an idea introduced publicly for the first time on Monday, is a first-ever temporary 20% cap on appraisal increases for properties valued at \$5 million or lower that aren't considered homesteads. Those would include second homes, vacation properties, rental houses, or commercial retail or business properties.

If the property tax deal marks a new era of cooperation between the House and Senate, they will need much more collaboration going forward. Abbott's "school choice" special session will center on another highly contentious proposal — and Abbott has suggested he will continue to tie it to more popular education issues, like teacher pay raises. While Abbott has not announced the specific timing of the next special session, lawmakers are eyeing October of this year.

Texas House Bill 3: School Safety



According to a story in the Texas Tribune, heeding Abbott's call, state lawmakers passed House Bill 3. The broad legislation expands and reinforces several existing school safety efforts, like requiring mental health training for more school staff, and outlines more ways schools can use funding for school safety. The law will go into effect in September, but lawmakers gave schools some flexibility to meet the requirements for armed guards and staff mental health training.

Despite the renewed focus on school safety, state lawmakers largely ignored calls from Uvalde parents for more gun regulations. During this year's regular session, the families pushed for a bill that would've raised the minimum age to buy an AR-style weapon from 18 to 21. The bill saw some traction in the Legislature, but it failed to pass along with several other proposed firearm safety measures.

HB 3 also creates a new safety and security department within the TEA to be led by Abbott's appointed chief of school safety and security. That department will be tasked with monitoring school districts' compliance with safety requirements, including the intruder detection audits ordered by Abbott. If a district fails to submit school safety information or address any concerns, the new law gives the commissioner of education the power to appoint a conservator to oversee the district's school board and superintendent and correct the issues. The law says this corrective action would not apply to school districts that fail to have an armed officer at every school.
