Lampasas County is under an excessive heat warning until 8pm tonight

Today: Look for it to be sunny and hot with a high temperature topping out near 1042°. The wind will be SW at 5-10 mph shifting SE this afternoon.

Lampasas Reverts to Stage III Water Restrictions

The water leak in the main line from Kempner Water has been repaired. However, a Boil water notice stays in effect for the entire City of Lampasas and the Kempner Water Supply Corporation system. As soon as the Boil Water Notice is lifted, the city and Kempner Water will notify residents.

The City of Lampasas thanks all residents for their efforts to conserve water during this time, it was amazing.

The City of Lampasas has reverted to Stage III drought restrictions as of yesterday. Citizens are asked to do all they can to conserve water and are reminded that all requirements of Stage II water restrictions stay in place during stage III restrictions and that residents are only allowed to water their landscape once a week.

Please keep in mind that the Drought Stage can change at any time, as the City continues to monitor reservoirs.

Petition Requesting Moratorium on Utility Disconnections

On June 22nd, the AARP Texas filed a petition with the Public Utility Commission of Texas seeking an emergency rule to help residential electricity customers facing disconnection due to non-payment.

The request aims to help an unknown number of utility customers who may have built up high unpaid balances during a just-ended moratorium on utility disconnections. The PUC put the moratorium for non-payments in place in mid-February amid the winter storm that triggered widespread power outages across the state. With the moratorium over, payment plans with favorable terms to consumers are now urgently needed to help electricity customers avoid dangerous disconnection, according to the AARP Texas petition.

A PUC directive requires deferred payment plans to be offered to customers who request one through November. But the emergency action sought by AARP Texas calls for flexible payment terms to give customers a better chance to keep up with their bills and maintain electric service. (cont'd on back)

Federal Broadband Money

(Texas Tribune) When Texas was awarded \$3.3 billion in federal money last month toward expanding broadband infrastructure across the state, government leaders and telecommunication companies celebrated the news.

With more than 7 million residents disconnected from the rest of the World Wide Web, Texas' broadband needs were no secret. With the federal funds, coupled with \$1.5 billion from the state's wallet, rural and underserved Texas communities finally saw a chance to catch up with technology in the rest of the country.

The regulations require each telecommunication company applying for a grant to provide a letter of credit from a major bank that covers at least 25% of the proposed project — essentially putting millions of dollars on the table to apply for a grant it isn't guaranteed to receive. This is a feasible task for big service providers with access to a qualified bank, but for rural companies, it's a different story. For many of them, the requirement that they work with a major bank to secure funding is another hurdle in their efforts to bring broadband access to their own backyard.

Kelty Garbee, executive director of Texas Rural Funders, said she understands the requirement exists to prevent people from accepting money but not following through with projects. However, "This is going to prevent the communities it's intended to serve from being able to access the money," Garbee said.

Comptroller Glenn Hegar's office, which oversees the state's broadband office, did not respond to a request for comment.

The Broadband Development Office is hosting public meetings through Aug. 16 throughout the state to get local input on the state's broadband needs.
