(cont'd from front) but enough for an elevator shaft. They are addressing the mechanical, electrical and plumbing issues as well as updating the kitchen and putting bathrooms in upstairs.

Mr. de Graffenried wanted to thank all the city utility customers for conserving water and make sure everyone knows the city appreciates it. He stated that there are days when the city has a reduction of close to 1.5 million gallons of water from last year due to conservation efforts of our residents. He also reminds us that we are still in a critical stage and that Stillhouse Hollow lake is at one of the lowest levels it has ever had .

## TEA Delaying Release of School Ratings

The Texas Education Agency announced Tuesday it would delay the release of its annual school ratings to account for scoring changes that could negatively impact schools under a revamped version of the agency's accountability system.

The TEA, which was supposed to release the ratings on Sept. 28, now expects the rankings to be released sometime next month. The delay comes after months of complaints from school officials across the state who have said the TEA's new accountability system would result in unfair drops in their ratings.

Under the system, districts and their campuses are assigned an A-F grade based on students' results in the state's standardized test, academic growth year-to-year, graduation rates and how well they prepare kids for a career after high school.

The TEA said it delayed the release of this year's ratings to make adjustments in the "academic growth" category. School districts experienced a huge rise in that category in 2022 as kids returned to the classroom after the pandemic and started doing better on the state test. The agency believed schools could see steep declines in their ratings if it didn't account for test scores stabilizing and returning to pre-pandemic levels.

## Red Cross Warning of Blood Shortage

The American Red Cross announced a national blood shortage and is calling on more people to donate blood and platelets to shore up its supply, which it said has "fallen to critically low levels."

The organization, which is headquartered in D.C. and collects and distributes around 40 percent of the country's blood donations, said its blood supply has dropped nearly 25 percent since early August, a shortfall of about 30,000 blood and platelet donations.

The Red Cross said "back-to-back" months of climate disasters in parts of the country have made it harder for people to get to donation centers and blood drives even as weather events like flooding and hurricanes can put greater demand on the blood supply. An unusually busy August travel season also has hampered donations.

Weather can also affect the organization's ability to distribute blood. The Red Cross said "more than 700 units of blood and platelets" were left uncollected when Hurricane Idalia hit Florida a few weeks ago.
